SATURDAY SELECTION

We are all looking forward to an excellent bowling season in 2013-14 and we plan to go a long way to further lift the performance of the Club as a whole.

We had an excellent meeting of the playing group on Monday 26 August at the Club during which we put forward the reasons why you should participate in an enthusiastic and cooperative way. There were 84 members there that evening and all were asked to fill in a questionnaire. The submissions you made in that paper, we hope will help you to understand what you want from the club. They should also help the Match Committee understand your ambitions and how you want to best help the club achieve its goals this season. My thanks to those members that completed the forms that night.

Some of you were not there and we will get a copy of the questionnaire to you so we have all players' completed forms. The information you gave on those forms is being processed for use this season and there is a lot to digest.

Below are the set of principles we discussed at the meeting and we hope you will abide by these principles now and into the future. We, the Match Committee intend to stick to our side of the bargain we made that night.

I am going to ask each of you to abide by a set of principles as follows:

- I will let my bowls do my talking for me. I will play well and contribute to my team's success. Why, because my actions will speak louder than words!!!
- I will set myself personal development goals.
- I will acknowledge areas where I am weak and approach my club coaches for assistance and practice my problems areas and turn these into my strengths.
- I will put the team goals ahead of my own aspirations.
- I will trust the decisions of the match committee and support those decisions in every way possible.
- I will only discuss team selection off the green and in a constructive way.
- I will play as part of a team and act as part of the team both on and off the green.

In turn, we the Club Selectors promise that we will:

- Make selection decisions that will first and foremost help us achieve the clubs goal of getting our first side into division 1 and improving the overall standing of all the pennant sides.
- Give all players opportunities to play to the best of their ability and potential.
- Consider players capability, skills, experience, current form and compatibility when making selection decisions.
- We will be open and transparent about selection considerations.
- We pledge to be objective and unprejudiced in our selection.
- We will endeavour to accommodate player's preferences where possible as long as that aligns with the team goal and doesn't put the overall success of the team at risk.

Along with the coaches and other interested parties, we are developing a "Game Plan". The Game Plan will help to focus our concentration on the green and we hope that it will contribute to gaining that winning edge for the club. We will be introducing the game plan to you as soon as possible.

Please don't forget the advantage that good practice and strong coaching can make to your game. You know the comments your opponents make on the green, such as "that was a lucky shot" etc., well it's interesting but I've noticed that the more I practice the "luckier" I get.

Go out there, play those "lucky" shots and enjoy your game. Good luck and good bowling.
